Item 6	CEO Susan Ahrens reminded members of the context of the current strategy against which
	the report is provided in order to support those new and joining us for the first time. This
6.4 Annual	strategic plan was developed in consultation with the members during a planning
Report	weekend held late in 2018. It was formally adopted by our members at our 2019 AGM
	and since then we have been working to achieve this plan and are pleased once again to
	report on progress against the three strategic priorities: a stronger organization, a stronger

system and stronger international performances. Susan also reported progress against the Weise Report which was conducted last year with support of provinces and government and to which FHC's board of directors formally adopted.

Susan thanked her staff team for their work throughout the year. She also thanked departing board member Rhonda Lewis for her decade of service as FHC board member, and recognized departing FHA ED, Burgundy Biletski for her decade with FHA where she has increased their membership to grow FHA to our second larger member PSO.

Following the CEO reports, FHBC President Denise McGeachy highlighted Tyler Klenk and Jo Wurdich as umpires in recent Junior Pan Am Games. FHBC President Denise McGeachy also asked for clarification as to when the 2028 high performance plan would be shared. Susan Ahrens noted this has been to the board of directors and whilst edits continue, HPM Adam Janssen has discussed this with the identified PSO HP leads in their regular meetings. Adam Janssen offered further clarification that it had been agreed in the last meeting with HP leads that the plan would be presented in their next meeting scheduled for September. FHBC's HP lead John Sacre was aware of this. Denise McGeachy asked that their ED, Mark Saunders be included in the next correspondence.

Richard Crowell wished it to be noted that FHO object to some current work as it competes with the work being undertaken by FHO. FHO has three objections:

- i. to national database
- ii. to programs being run by FHC in the province
- iii. to FHC contacting anyone directly as all communication should come through the PSO's.

Denise McGeachy registered FHBC's agreement to item 2.

CEO Susan Ahrens responded. The objections were acknowledged. Susan emphasized that FHC and our member associations are not in a competition with one another - instead we should be building our sport system together. We have the strategy in place and are driving to provide a quality sport experience for all, inclusive athletes, umpires, officials – Susan urged all members to retain this at the center of all thinking. There is much to be done in our community and for our sport that we need to avoid duplication, look at ways to share the workload and build on the opportunity to do so through our team of teams
