6.4 Annual Report

CEO Susan Ahrens reminded members of the context of the current strategy against which the report is provided in order to support those new and joining us for the first time. This strategic plan was developed in consultation with the members during a planning weekend held late in 2018. It was formally adopted by our members at our 2019 AGM and since then we have been working to achieve this plan and are pleased once again to report on progress against the three strategic priorities: a stronger organization, a stronger system and stronger international performances.

Susan also reported progress against the Weise Report which was conducted last year with support of provinces and government and to which FHC's board of directors formally adopted.

The CEO noted the most pressing priority for the coming season - and the one which underpins international success, is that which comes from building the sustainable system — that is, the diversification of revenue streams. FHC's leadership of the Targeted Athlete Strategy and talent system build out is central to this outcome.

Susan thanked her staff team for their work throughout the year. She also thanked the Board, Members, committees and system partners for their continued work and support.

Denise Mc Geachy, FHCB, thanked Susan for her report. In noting the helpfulness of the Weise report dashboard, Denise expressed her recommendation that the Weise reporting as shared in the meeting by the CEO, should be shared with the broader registered participant group.

Denise also commended that FHC consider the creation of an additional COF Trust Fund for officials as a future priority.

The CEO thanked Denise for the comments. Susan concurred that this may be useful, easily achievable and indicated that the broader reporting directly to registered participants was something FHC would deliver in the coming season.

Barb Carmichael, PEI, asked how long it would be before Ontario were back within the membership fold as this has the potential to affect girls from the Atlantic's were going to join FHC programming delivered in Ontario hubs. The CEO noted that FHO is currently suspended due to breaching FHC's bylaws and failing to remedy this within the 1-month period of notice provided to them. FHC's CEO and President have verbally confirmed a mutually agreeable solution and we remain hopeful of a

	quick and positive resolution. This is in the hands of the FHO board.
	Alberta and BC noted their concern regarding the suspension.
