WHAT IS INDOOR FIELD HOCKEY?

Indoor hockey started in Europe as an alternate way to practice hockey in the months of winter when it was too cold to play the sport outdoors. Over the years, the game has developed and evolved into the fast, skillful and action-packed version of hockey that it is today, with countries all over the world playing the sport throughout the year.

The game is played on a hockey specific indoor flooring material in the shape of a rectangle 40 metres long and 20 metres wide. There are boards placed on the side perimeters of the pitch (but not the backline) that keep the ball in play. The scoring circle has a nine-metre radius from the center of the goal-line and the penalty spot is marked seven metres from the center of the goal-line.

Each team in indoor hockey consists of 6 players that includes 5 outfield players and 1 goalkeeper. Teams can choose to play with 6 outfield players by not playing a goalkeeper. The total size of a squad in indoor hockey is 12 players and rolling substitutions are permitted.

An indoor hockey match is played over a course of 40 minutes, split in 4 quarters of 10 minutes each.

Indoor hockey requires players to possess some very similar skills to outdoor hockey, and some that are unique to the indoor format of the game. These include the ability to use the side boards to make passes and beat players, which is a crucial skill given that lifting the ball to dribble past players (the 3D skills commonly used in the outdoor game) are not permitted in indoor hockey. Lifting the ball is only permitted when a player attempts to score a goal from inside the scoring circle, by the use of a flicking motion. The flicking motion is defined as: raising the ball off the ground by placing the head of the stick under the ball and using a lifting movement.

Hitting, striking or slap hitting the ball, using a swinging movement of the stick towards the ball, is not permitted anywhere on the pitch.



TOURNAMENT PHOTOGRAPHY

The tournament will have multiple official photographers. Media will have access to the venue as well. Please highlight if you are a media member who intends on using the photography areas.

Every match will have a photo album with access granted to national organizations and media by the PAHF and will be updated regularly throughout each competition day. Please note in your application if you'd like to be on this list with the photo gallery.

PLAYER & COACH AVAILABILITY

There will be a mixed-zone where members of the media are welcome to come to meet and interview athletes, coaches and members of staff. Generally, the athletes will cross-through this area after matches. Athletes and coaches will be encouraged to move through the mixed-zone after each match. For the Indoor Pan American Cup, there will not be a mandatory mixed-zone attendance for all athletes. Please connect directly to tournament media contacts and team managers to line up specific interviews with athletes.

For interviews outside of competition time, please contact the tournament media staff to make arrangements for specific media opportunities. There will be certain black-out times due to the competition schedule, but we will aim to be as flexible as possible to meet the media's needs.

The last time Canada hosted the Indoor Pan American Championships was in 2005 in Waterloo, Ontario. Since then, the event has taken place in Argentina, Venezuela, Uruguay, Guyana, and in 2021, it was held in Pennsylvania, USA. Canada's men's team last qualified for the Indoor World Cup in 2015, and the women's team achieved a record eighth place at the 2023 FIH Indoor World Cup in South Africa.
